Since there was no February meeting, we'll take this opportunity to provide some additional information about your fire department that normal space restraints haven't allowed. First, please become familiar with your Board members. Fred Hill is president, aided by Dwayne McIntosh, Sandy Handsaker, Lajeane Yates, and Jim Rust. Their goal is to responsibly manage the fire department's resource to provide the best care and safety for our community. They invite you to come to meetings or discuss any issues of concerns with them. And they're real nice people.

Second, be very grateful for our 16 active volunteers who devote tons of time to training, plus they respond at a moment's notice to any emergency. Consider joining this amazing group, because there are a lot of volunteer opportunities that may not involve crawling in a burning building or pulling a crash victim from a car. Find out how you can help.

Third, Chief Glenn is always eager to recommend safety measures for us all. Right now, he's encouraging everyone to clean up debris around homes that might contribute to fire hazards. With fewer fuels, we all diminish the potential for a deadly spread of fires. He also reminds propane users to make sure they have operable carbon monoxide detectors in the home. And it doesn't hurt to

periodically have a professional make sure all your parts and pieces are secure and working correctly. Change batteries in smoke alarms.
